2010: The IHE Review has changed

Learn about the revised procedures which cut down your paperwork and evidence collection.

From January 2010, rather than a report, you submit 16 Forms summarising your work experience backed up by a portfolio of supporting evidence of your competence and commitment matched against Engineering Council Standards. You also give us a one page summary of a couple of projects that you will present at the Review interview.

The course explains and guides you through the review entry requirements, the standards and the new processes. There is advice on how you can prepare a convincing submission to show you meet the national Engineering Council standards using your work experience.

IHE reviewers and mentors attend to pass on practical tips and advice.

Your own mentor is welcome to attend without charge

Who needs to use the non standard route?

If you do not meet current or previously approved academic entry requirements, you can show equivalent knowledge by completing further learning or a Technical Report.

IHE's July course is for senior IEngs or recent BSc or BEng graduates seeking CEng and for recent HNC/HND graduates, or those with experience only, seeking IEng.

Which Course?

Email membership@ihie.org.uk to check which course is for you. Tell us your qualification title, date awarded and the college or university and attach a CV.

The two general courses cover all routes and all levels.

For CEng or the Technical Report and non-standard options, come to the July or October courses.

Before the course

Delegates are asked to provide copies of their qualifications (including lists of units) to allow personal advice on the day.
